CAROLINA WOMEN ON MISSION & MYMISSION GATHERING

October 15-16, 2021 at Connie Maxwell Children's Ministries (CMCM) 41 participants gathered to hear a missionary, J, share about her work. Fifty children attended the GA Day event at Beaumont Baptist Church in Spartanburg on January 30, 2022. They participated in sending birthday wishes to missionaries, crafts, listening to missionary stories, learning songs, enjoying lunch, and other fun activities.









STUDENTS

SC WMU partnered with Impact of Myrtle Beach to host 84 students (Acteens, Youth on Mission) and their leaders for a ministry event in Myrtle Beach on September 18, 2021. Students and their leaders participated in day camps, played with children and taught Bible stories. Students provided cookies to hotel staff, played Bible frisbee on the beach and provided face painting to kids. Students learned what it means to make disciples locally and globally and that every follower of Jesus is commanded to make disciples.

A few highlights from the summer:

- During camp, some of the cabin leaders shared their testimonies with the older girls and gave them an opportunity to share their own stories. Even though it meant missing camp activities (archery, riflery and swimming), the girls asked if they could continue sharing testimonies. They shared for at least two hours and had a sweet time of fellowship.
- After learning about Bible storying during the missions session, many of the children and youth have been putting it into practice by retelling the Bible stories to others.
- A child that came from an unchurched home accepted Christ and is planning to find a church near her house.
 Her mother (a non-believer) is very supportive of helping her find a church.

COMPASSION ministries

Christmas Backpacks

On December 12-14, 2022, 30 individuals from around 10 churches joined Spartanburg County Network on their annual trip to Jenkins, Kentucky. They gave out over 1,700 backpacks to the students of Burdine Elementary, Jenkins Middle/ High School, Fleming Neon Middle School, Dorton Elementary, and Blaine Elementary Schools.

The area is predominately "coal-country" with addictions that plague the low-economic region. School retention rates are always a battle, particularly in the area of teen-pregnancy. The opportunity to have a presence is made possible by our local NAMB missions partners, Lester and Bessie McPeek. They have been a loving presence and because of their work 363 days of the year we can help support their ministry by sharing backpacks with their community.

Overall, 3,600 backpacks were collected in South Carolina which were dispersed by various ministries in Georgia, Kentucky, and South Carolina. Along with age appropriate items, each backpack contained a Bible, a copy of the Christmas story, and was collected from churches just like yours!







PROJECT HELP: REFUGEES

This Afghan family walked 40 days across Afghanistan and Iran to get to Turkey. In Turkey they were vetted and received refugee status to come to America. They were settled in Columbia, SC where they are living and working to try and rebuild their lives. Most refugees have the same hopes and dreams we have: protection, education, and a way to support themselves and their families. As followers of Jesus, we must help them navigate their new culture and show them the love of Jesus.







PRISONER PACKETS

In 2021 South Carolina Baptist collected 24,489 packets from churches/associations across the state. Every inmate in SC received a gift. All extra packets were divided among chaplains to use at their institutions throughout the year when there is a need.

COMPASSION ministries

SC Baptist Nursing Fellowship (BNF)

BNF in South Carolina works through regional chapters led by a regional director. The desire of BNF members is to use their medical skills to serve others, build relationships with people and share Christ with them.

This year ministries to nursing schools and their students included:

- Blessing of the Hands ceremony at universities for graduating nursing students
- Distribution of gift bags to graduating nursing students
- Provision of gift baskets for nursing professors and instructors at Anderson University
- Encouraging and mentoring nursing students who have a heart for missions
- Partnering with a local Gideon's auxiliary to provide New Testaments for graduating student nurses and for the Sandra's bags

New Ministry: Sandra's Bags

Initiated a new ministry to five chemo infusion centers in South Carolina called "Sandra's Bags." The bags are filled with handmade lap robes/quilts and other comfort items. The ministry is named for one of our member's daughters who while receiving chemo brought a bag of comfort items to give to a new chemo patient each time, she had her chemo. Sandra lost her battle with breast cancer. We have taken up the ministry with her mother in honor of Sandra. Three to four bags are being delivered each quarter to each of the five infusion centers in the Waccamaw area.

Attendees heard stories from current and former missions personnel, and learned about foster care opportunities, partnership opportunities, unique forms of ministry, ministry with refugees, planned giving to missions causes, and much more. They learned about missions work being done in South Carolina, North America, and beyond. Friday afternoon offered attendees opportunities to: participate in mission action and mission support projects for the local community; attend break-out sessions; and visit exhibits featuring missions/WMU. There was a reception held for Laurie Register and Donna Britt, who have set their retirement dates. Business conducted included: 1) Cindy Burns, Jones Avenue Church, Easley, was elected to her third term as South Carolina WMU president; 2) the 2022-2023 Executive Board was elected; 3) the site for the 2025 Annual Meeting at Sweetwater Church, North Augusta, was approved; and 4) Triple A association and church recipients were recognized. This meeting would not have been possible without the host church committees.

MISSION support

258 gift checks were provided to South Carolina missionaries and Third Culture Kids (TCKs) through the Janie Chapman Offering. Gift checks are sent when missionaries are appointed or commissioned, to current and retired missionaries at Christmas, and twice a year to TCKs of South Carolina missionaries attending college/university and to any TCK attending a college/university in South Carolina.

2022 Janie Chapman OfferingSM for State Missions, Missions Education and Kingdom ADVANCE in South Carolina − From January 1-December 31, 2022

\$1,990,562.02 was given to the Janie Chapman Offering. This represents a 3.4% increase or \$66,068 more than 2021 receipts. A check for \$1,259,504.42 was sent to the South Carolina Baptist Convention to support the Convention initiatives of Serve, Share, Send, Start, and Strengthen, as well as associational ministries and the Advance Strategy Premiere Learning Event. WMU received \$731,057.60 for Camp La Vida and WMU ministries/work. When the WMU Executive Board meets in March 2023, the interest earned, less account fees, will be allocated. We did fall short of our goal of \$2,100,000, however, thanks to South Carolina Baptists we received one of the largest offerings ever!

State Missions



Transforming Lives Together was the theme for September 2021. We continued to offer Zoom calls with the missionaries featured in the prayer guide for State Missions. Resources were provided to help all age groups pray for, learn about, and support State Missions. Four videos were produced to promote the Janie Chapman Offering SM.
